# Phil's Jazz Chat

I was excited to hear that one of the world's greatest traditional jazz trumpeters/cornetists, Jon-Erik Kellso, will be coming to Australia as

a guest of this year's Australian Jazz Convention. Jon-Erik is a wonderful player who I have had the privilege of hearing live on several occasions

The Australian Jazz Convention (AJC) is the world's longest running event of its type, having been started in 1946 by traditional jazz enthusiasts based in Melbourne. It is unusual in that it is not a jazz festival, but a non-profit convention for musicians and enthusiastic listeners to meet each other, network, and play/listen together. The musicians pay a fee to participate rather than being paid. It is held every year at different locations



around the country from Boxing Day to New Year's Eve. This year it will be at Mildura.

#### SHORT BIO

Since moving from Detroit to NYC in 1989 to join Vince Giordano's Nighthawks, trumpeter Jon-Erik Kellso has enjoyed playing with a wide array of musical stylists, including Catherine Russel, Dick Hyman, Levon Helm, Leon Redbone, and Wynton Marsalis. He can be heard leading the EarRegulars at the historic Ear Inn in NYC on Sunday nights.

His sound is recognizable in television and movie soundtracks, such as "Ghost World", "The Aviator", "Bessie", "The Marvelous Mrs. Moisel", and "Boardwalk Empire" for which the nighthawks won a Grammy, as well as over 100 recordings including his most recent CD Jon-Erik Kellso and the EarRegulars Live at the Ear Inn.

The Tin Roof Jazz Band commenced in 1986 when Roy Burton, President of the Jazz Club of WA, assembled six classically-trained musicians, including current leader Vivienne Kidd (piano), and later Martin Kidd (banjo). The band played three or four gigs a week plus regular gigs at the Jazz Club of WA, until 1994 when Martin and Vivienne relocated to Spain. Tin Roof has had a second life since Vivienne reformed the band about four years ago, with original players Mike, Tim and Steve and welcoming Dijon and Benn. These awesome musicians relish each other's work and know

that the audience will love listening and dancing to their music as much as they enjoy playing it.

This is the first club night for **spring**. Why not dress in a **floral theme**? ...It's up to you.


# 10 Sep Hills Big Band



Hills Big Band bring their style and groove to any occasion. Its Swing... and it's a whole lot more too. They present the familiar Count Basie and Glenn Miller numbers and their two stunning vocalists skilfully cover the work of Frank Sinatra and Billie Holiday. And yet... the Hills Big Band leave no stone unturned, bringing you great arrangements of pieces by the Beatles, Michael Bublé, Earth Wind and Fire,

Duke Ellington, Bon Jovi, Steely Dan, Van Morrison, Louis Prima, Quincy Jones and James Morrison. With their roots in the Perth Hills, they have grown to handle major gigs, for example filling the Ellington Jazz Club many times and featuring in the Live at the Northbridge Piazza series in 2012 and 2014.

Led by Musical Director **Tom Salleo**, future star trombonist/pianist and arranger, the members of the band are a disparate bunch from the Perth Hills and beyond. The players include professional musicians, teachers, ex-soldiers, university students, business people and retirees; all have a common interest in preserving and presenting all that's best in big band music.



# 17 Sep Cornerhouse Jazz Band



The Corner House Jazz Band plays traditional jazz with a hard-driving style, and is one of Australia's most accomplished jazz bands. The band was formed in 1980, playing at the Railway Hotel, North Fremantle, and still plays at the Swan Hotel nearby every Saturday afternoon. They have had a 20 year Friday-night residency at the famous Jazz Cellar in Mount Hawthorn. The Cellar jumps with the band's pumping and nostalgic repertoire, including New Orleans Jazz, Chicago styles, roaring 20s, Swing, Duke Ellington's Cotton Club jungle jazz, Louis Armstrong's Hot Fives and Sevens, John

Phillip Sousa Marches, and... much, much more. The Cornerhouse Jazz Band has toured overseas, twice to the USA, to Malaysia, Japan, New Zealand and Borneo, and have played in all the Australian states.

We last had them in the club to celebrate St. Georges Day (pictured) and we're looking forward to hearing them on the 17<sup>th</sup> September.

## 24 Sep Doctor Jazz



Doctor Jazz have been playing at the Jazz Club for many years; their first jazz club gig was in 1998 at the Hyde Park Hotel when their singer, Tristan, was 14 years old! They play many traditional jazz favourites, American song book classics and jazz numbers from the great British jazz revival period, such as Acker Bilk and the Chris Barber Band.

From time to time the band has to adjust to a change in the line up due to the loss of a player because they have retired and in a couple of cases recently a band member has passed. This time their much-loved pianist **Dave Cowie** has decided it is time to retire and we thank him for his wonderful support and his unique style of playing over the last 3 -4 decades.

"Dr Jazz" are pleased to introduce their new pianist in her debut at the Club – **Ali McKenzie**. Ali is a classical pianist who trained at WAAPA. She has recently retired from her academic career and has decided to turn her attention to have some fun playing jazz. Please give her a big welcome."





### In Profile: Bob Benton

Paul talks to Bob.

### Q. How did you get into music?

**A.** It was back in 1961, at <u>East Victoria Park</u> Primary School, when Sammy Maher started up

a school brass band.

# Q. How did you get interested in jazz?

A. Well, actually, all of my training was classical. And then one day somebody said "Dixie Kidd is looking for a trombone player". That was about 1981; I would have been 33. He said "just play notes 1 & 5" and I got bored, so I



started finding some other notes to play.

# Q. You would have played with a few bands since then?

**A.** I have... importantly for me, I was actually a trombone player in the army band when they had a full-time army band here. I got paid to practice!

### Q. Who are your favourite trombone players?

A. Without a doubt, <u>Urbie Green</u> and <u>Bill</u>
<u>Watrous</u>. They've got all the technique in the world and they can really use it. They also have a real silky, smooth, creamy sound. If they're playing a <u>ballad</u> I really like that, and if they want to bring up the <u>fireworks</u> they've got the <u>technique</u> to do it.

# Q. Who are your favourite musicians on other instruments?

**A.** You couldn't go far past Armstrong, because he basically invented the profession of being a jazz player. I like the big orchestral brass sounds of the London, Berlin & Chicago Symphony Orchestras. And...well there are so many great players, and so many idioms.

# Q. Do you have any advice for young musicians wanting to get into jazz?


A. Can I quote Bill Watrous? "Keep your instrument clean, because that way it's going to blow the same way all the time, and listen to lots of J.S. Bach, because that was all improvising". Other than that, learn all your scales. You'll probably hate playing scales, but learn them, because that's what we base everything on: all your arpeggios, all of the tunes, they're just combinations of bits of scales and arpeggios. And if you know those, and if you can train your ears to hear it, you'll be fine. And, otherwise, just listen to lots of other people play jazz!

# **Battle of the Bands**

Band Coordinator & VP Phil Hatton has started to field queries from high schools interested in competing in next year's Battle of the Bands — with the final scheduled for 6<sup>th</sup> May 2025.

This trad jazz competition gives an opportunity for the next generation of WA musicians to strut their stuff, get some live gigging experience, and to learn more about **traditional jazz**.

The club's support for this includes hosting the **final**, offering **prizes** towards the winning



schools' music program, providing charts where possible, and by arranging a tutorial clinic with the rehearsing bands.

# Perth Jazz Men Tops In The East - 1949


This fascinating article




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
