Phil's Jazz Chat

Eddie Condon was an interesting character who had a big impact in the world of traditional jazz. He was a guitarist/ banjoist but did not feature as an instrumentalist. His impact was in his band leading and entrepreneurial abilities.

Born in 1905, he was self taught on banjo and ukulele and starting working professionally at the age of 15 with Hollis Peavey's Jazz Bandits. Living in Chicago in the 1920s, he fell in with the so called "Austin High Gang" which included such stellar musicians as Gene Krupa, Frank Teschemacher, Bud Freeman, Jimmy McPartland and Joe Sullivan.

In 1927 he formed the Condon-McKenzie Chicagoans with Red Mckenzie (noted for his solos using comb and paper!). Their initial recordings are acknowledged as classics that laid the foundation for "Chicago Style" jazz. In the 1930s, Condon was based in New York and worked with many bands including the Mound City Blue Blowers (with McKenzie), Joe Marsala, Bobby Hackett and Artie Shaw. During the Second World War he put on a series of Town Hall concerts, aimed at lifting the spirits of the servicemen fighting overseas, which included many famous quest musicians. These have become iconic recordings.

Condon was always a great champion of traditional jazz and always surrounded himself with outstanding musicians. In the 1950s his bands played good old dixie standards but had evolved to using swing based rhythm sections. The energy levels were always high and the quality of the ensembles and soloists stellar. It was a living music which, while paying homage to the past, had evolved to incorporate some of the developments in jazz.

Condon was a great raconteur and his stage presence and rapport with his audiences was a great asset. He was famous for his dry wit. He and many of his contemporaries were heavy drinkers. When bebop developed during and after the war, it featured the sound of the flattened 5th chord. Eddie famously said, "We don't flatten our fifths ... we drink 'em"

Eddie Condon died in 1973 and a club was established in his name, featuring many of the musicians he had played with, on West 54th St in New York City. The club named "Condons" operated from March 1975 to July 1985.

This band has been playing at the Jazz Club for many years. Our first Jazz Club gig was in 1998 at the Hyde Park Hotel when our singer, Tristan, was 14 years old! We play many traditional jazz favourites, American Song Book classics and jazz numbers from the British jazz revival bands such as Acker Bilk and from the Chris Barber Band.



JUNE 11 SOUTH PERTH LIONS BIG BAND

Under the experienced direction of Phil Hatton, the South Perth Lions big band performs for dances, Lions events, festivals, fundraisers and public events such as the annual community Carols at Sunset. The band also plays several times a year for corporate events and private func-tions. Band mem-bers donate their services and all profits raised support the Youth Music Program and the community service of the South Perth Lions Club. For their performance at the Jazz Club of WA, they are looking forward to showcasing their pre World War 2 repertoire, including some rarely heard arrangements of traditional jazz favourites by the likes of Jelly Roll Morton, Kid Ory and Lew Pollack. They are inspired by the early jazz big band sounds of Fletcher Henderson, Jean Goldkette, Bob Crosby and Duke Ellington. Expect to hear some big band classics from Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw and Glenn Miller too.



JUNE 18 PHIL HATTON'S MANHATTONS

The Manhattons is a band that plays all styles of traditional jazz, always reflecting the spirit of the music but adding a touch of its own. Featuring some of Perth's best musicians they play a wide range of sounds and arrangements from Jelly Roll Morton and Louis Armstrong classics to original and innovative arrangements of Dixieland favourites. They also like to keep the music very danceable



JUNE 25 NEW ORLEANS HERITAGE JAZZ BAND

Since 1986, the New Orleans Heritage Jazzband has been delighting audiences and jazz lovers with its foot tapping driving music played in the free-flowing, pulsating, revivalist New Orleans style of that famous city.

The band was originally formed for the Jazz Club of WA as its house band with a view to backing guest musicians and singers. Don Bancroft (trumpet) and Dave Cowie (piano) assembled the band from members of popular jazz band like The Storyville Jazzband and The Cornerhouse Jazzband.

The band's policy was simple: "we all play, or we don't play!" Hence Heritage has had the same rhythm section since its inception. Front line members have changed over the years and for this final performance, the band will consist of Robbie Bresland (trumpet), Bob Benton (trombone), Murray Kent (reeds), Dave Cowie (piano), Rod Evans (banjo), John Healy (double bass and vocals) and Nige Ridgway (drums and vocals).

So don't miss this opportunity to say farewell on Tuesday 25th June to a wonderful band, which has contributed so much to the traditional jazz art form in Perth.


